Eradicating invasive species is a costly and challenging task, but stopping them from spreading and keeping tabs on where they are, makes that job a lot easier. July's Board Meeting was held July 21, 2025, at 7:00 pm. Many thanks to the community members who joined us in person and virtually! Highlights from the meeting:

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED (And Appreciated!!)

CHANGES TO PATIO REQUIREMENTS

Queen's Landing has been here a long time, and over time, owners have made various modifications to their units and patios. Anyone who walks the community can see the variations in patio sizes, and agree that it's not a good look. After careful consideration and consulting with Counsel, the Board voted to allow patios to extend to the "Building Boundary Line" vs. the "Limited Common Element Line" as shown on the building plat. Not only will this improve how the community looks, it gives owners an opportunity for a more usable outdoor space.

What does this mean?

- As far as process, nothing has changed. All modifications must go through the ACR process and gain approval from the Covenants Committee.
- Homeowners must acknowledge that they are building on Common Element property, have no ownership of that property, and are responsible for maintaining the patio.
