FINANCIALS

While the final 2025 numbers are not finalized yet, it looks like Queen's Landing will realize a moderate loss. This is due to Association portion of the cost of individual unit water damage and plumbing repairs, grading and drainage issues, snow and trash removal, and concrete repairs. Auditors start their review of the 2025 financials in March.

COMCAST

Comcast continues their work on installing infrastructure, as weather allows. You will probably start hearing from them in April about their services. Remember, this is an added available service option; no resident is under any obligation to sign up with them.

MARINA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE UPDATE

Planning for repairs to the Marina bulkhead, docks and piers continues, as the Marina Executive Committee works to determine how best to fund it, schedule it, and prepare financially for long-term maintenance. This is an important project, not only to the marina but to the community as a whole, and will take place over several years. It's complicated, and it's possible you might hear bits and pieces about the process without the benefit of the whole picture. *Please know the best way to be informed is to attend meetings or talk to a Marina Executive Committee Member (headed up by Clark French). Rumors and misinformation help no one.*
