April 20, 2026, Board Meeting Recap

The April Board Meeting was held April 20 at 7:00 pm. Many thanks to the community members who joined us! A reminder that Important topics are covered, and decisions made, at Board meetings, all of which impact YOU as owners and residents. **The best way to stay informed is to attend the meetings, review the minutes, and read the recap. The worst way to stay informed is to rely on hearsay and second-hand information.**

Highlights from the meeting:

WELCOME LEE ABENDSCHOEN, ONSITE MANAGER

We welcomed the new FSR Onsite Manager, Lee Abendschoen. Please give him grace as he learns the new system and all the intricacies of our community!

THE SOCIAL COMMITTEE KEEPS THE GOOD TIMES ROLLING!

- The March 26 “AI: What Does it Have to Do with Me?” presentation in the Chester Room, followed by coffee and dessert, was very popular, with the speaker inviting attendees to stay for a bonus presentation!
- A Yard Sale will be held May 9 in the Chester Room and parking lot, rain or shine!
- And of course the BIG THREE: Memorial Day, 4th of July, and Labor Day! As you know by now, our amazing Social Committee puts on a heck of a party, so be sure to read your upcoming Digests for more details!
- A presentation on the dangers of plastics and how to avoid them is scheduled for October, by Plastic Free QAC.

WARM WEATHER IS HERE, AND WE'RE READY!

- Work continues on the pool deck and pool bulkhead, and we'll be in the pool by mid-May! The same process for obtaining pool access as last year (be current with your account and unit inspections, apply online) will be in place this year.
- Thanks to Rich Frost and the Recreational Facilities Committee members, the process for renewing small craft storage slots has been brought into the current century and will be a huge improvement for all concerned.

UNIT MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS

You may be getting tired of reading these requirements, but they are important! So:

- Spring HVAC servicing is due by May 30 (or May 11 in order to get pool access in time for pool opening)
- If owners submitted 2025 dryer vent cleaning, the next is due December 30, 2026.
- If we do not have a record of plumbing, sprinkler system, or fireplace inspection, those reports are due by May 30, 2026.

COMMUNICATION, COMMUNICATION, COMMUNICATION

- The new and improved bi-annual newsletter was shared electronically and has received very nice feedback.
- We are moving forward with the purchase and installation of a television screen that will post information, community photos, and more via a thumb-drive. This will allow timely information sharing with minimal volunteer effort.
- Please remind your neighbors about the Weekly Digest that is emailed each Thursday. It has the latest information that all residents need to know, such as the status of the Comcast installation, what to do about patios holding water, working with drainage pop-ups, where to find governing documents and more.

- And as always—you are encouraged to attend Board and Committee meetings. You can attend in person, or virtually. It's by far the best way to stay informed, and to share your input. Your voice matters, we want to hear it.

FINANCIALS

Auditors are reviewing our financials. There are still variances between FSR internal numbers and the audit numbers that we need to understand.

MARINA UPDATE

Work on bulkhead repairs will begin the week of April 20. The Marina Executive Committee is working to develop a cost-sharing proposal for the Queen's Landing Council of Unit Owners Board.

THIS IS A SIGNIFICANT ISSUE FOR QUEEN'S LANDING, AND WE STRONGLY ENCOURAGE ALL OWNERS TO ATTEND MEETINGS AND PAY CLOSE ATTENTION TO INFORMATION ISSUED BY THE ASSOCIATION BOARD AND THE MARINA BOARD, which are the only official sources of information.

REMINDERS FOR EVERYONE

- Please refrain from putting out your trash before dusk the evening before pickup. Leaving town before pickup? Drive it to the trash bins on your way out. It's an eyesore for your neighbors and enticing to animals.
- Use Night Mode on your sound systems so your awesome electronics don't bug your neighbors on the other side of the wall.
- Kids riding bikes can be hard to see; they can also make unpredictable moves. For everyone's safety, remind your kids to use caution.
- Do you use the fitness center? Please know that if you are under 16, you need to be accompanied by an adult 18 or over.
